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## ● ● ● Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

### **Partnership for Health**

(Brief Safer Sex and Adherence Intervention for HIV Outpatient Clinics) is an intervention at the level of care encouraging providers to promote safer sex and adherence among patients at six clinics across California.

### **SUMIT**

(Seropositive Urban Men's Intervention Trial) is a behavioral intervention trial to reduce risk of HIV transmission by MSM with HIV and to increase disclosure of positive status to sexual partners. Locations in San Francisco, CA (Bay Men) and New York metropolitan area.

### **INSPIRE**

(Interventions for SeroPositive IDUs: Research & Evaluation) is a behavioral intervention for IDUs to lower sexual and drug use risk, increase access to care, and increase adherence to HAART regimens. In San Francisco, CA (VOICE, now VENUS), Baltimore, MD, Miami, FL and New York City, NY.

### **Prevention for HIV-Infected Persons Project**

PHIPP is a five-year, CDC-funded demonstration project focused on prevention needs for people who have HIV. Project goals include increasing the number of high risk individuals who know their status, providing prevention services for those who are HIV infected, linking persons with HIV with care, and developing models for technology transfer from PHIPP to health departments, community planning groups, and community based organizations. Five health departments (the states of California, Maryland and Wisconsin, and the city and county of Los Angeles and San Francisco, CA) were selected to implement PHIPP.

- ▶ AIDS Healthcare Foundation offers services for partners of persons with HIV.
- ▶ Love Positive, a program at LA Shanti offering weekend retreats in English and Spanish to MSM and women and their partners.
- ▶ Tarzana Treatment Center focuses on persons who have been living with HIV for less than two years and are in substance abuse treatment.
